Dear Patrons,

Within weeks of our last tremendously successful play (and you helped make it a success) we have again found the strength (and funds) to stage another production.

"The Rainmaker" which is set in the Mid West of the 1930's was made famous by the screen version starring Burt Lancaster and Katharine Hepburn and later adapted for the musical stage under the name of "one Hundred and ten In the Shade" which had a successful run on Broadway and at the Cambridge Theatre in London. We trust that our attempt earns a similar reputation here in Cayman.

This is the Society's first approach to "Theatre workship", using a multiple set and differential lighting and as you will see upon entering the theatre we are working completely open stage. The set is the largest we have ever built covering more surface area than all our plays put together and certainly the most complex. If the stage collapses during performance, please forgive us - it's the weight of the wood!

Once again we have introduced some new talent and we feel sure that those making their debut will maintain, if not surpass our usual attempt at a high amateur standard.

Our audience is our very reason for existence as a Drama Society and we should like you to feel as much a part of Cayman Drama Society as those on stage or slaving away backstage.

We trust and sincerely hope that you will enjoy this production, but if this or any of our previous ones have not been quite your "cup of tea" we know that you will appreciate in the spirit in which it is presented - an honest attempt to please and entertain our friends as well as in pursuit of an absorbing, challenging and immensely worthwhile hobby.

Prior to that she majored in Drama in College and graduated from the American Academy of Dramatic Art in New York. She has appeared in numerous showcase productions off Broadway, in Summer Stoch Theatre and in two films. Whilst musical commedy is her forte' she says she is happy to do anything when she isn't too busy looking after her two children.



STANLEY PANTON - "STARBUCK"

Stan-the-Man needs no introduction - he was born in Grand Cayman, a few years ago his memory concerning the exact year is somewhat hazy. He joined the Drama Society at its inception and was its first Chairman. His theatrical experience is considerable having revived The Tripler Army Hospital Hospital Theatre and acted/directed with the Kailna Players in Hawaii. He was also a member of "The Playhouse" group in San Francisco and acted there in "La Rowe" "Mary, Queen of Scots" "Arms and the Man" and "Stalag 17". The part of Starbuck represents his first appearance for the Cayman Drama Society but not his debut on the Cayman stage as he has previously appeared in his own productions of "I'll be home for Christmas" and "Blithe Spirit".



KEITH BALL - "JIM CURRY"

Keith joined the Society shortly after his arrival in Cayman towards the end of 1971 and made his debut in April 1971 playing the part of John Evans in "Doctor in the House". He has also appeared for the Society in "Wait Until Dark" and produced the last play "Worms Eye View".

His interests are many and varied and he is often seen around the Island with his camera in search of newsworthy subjects, when he remembers to put film in his camera, his pictures are very good!

Although he has been an active participant in theatre Groups throughout his life, this is his first appearance on stage since his school days. He says he hopes it isn't his last, and we're sure it won't be after seeing his performance as "H.C.".



JOHN MORGAN "FILE"

Acting is by no means a new venture for John who has been keenly interested in all things theatrical since his "Variety" days in the intelligence Service of the R.A.F. He has worked with several socities in England both as actor, producer and general "washer-up". The plays he likes to remember best include Chekhov's "The Proposal" (which won a Festival Award), "Look Back in Anger", "Worm's Eye View", "Romanoff and Juliet", "The Long and the Short and the Tall".



BILL SHAW - "SHERIFF"

William L. Shaw (Bill to his friends) is Vice-President of Mercantile Bank and Trust Company and came to Cayman in October 1971. He has never been on stage before and only came to the auditions for "The Rainmaker" to keep his wife Gale company.
