DIRECTORS NOTES

It is with great pleasure that I invite you to sit back and enjoy our very first pantomime in The Prospect Playhouse. "Robinson Crusoe" is a very well known story by Daniel Defoe but I am sure this version will come as very much of a surprise. Of course, we have Robinson, the shipwreck and Man Friday complete with footprint in the sand. But there the similarity ends. Our pantomime starts in Grand Cayman, goes to Brazil and finishes up in the Misty Grey Isle in the East. On the way we meet Robinson's scatter brained brother Billy, his man mad mother of dubious sex Sarah, their friends Neat and Nutty, a Brazilian lady called Juanita and above all his love at first sight, the beautiful Josephine. Of course Josephine has a miserable but rich father (the surname is Skinflint and he lives up to it), nastiness in Sheik Allah Badah Bugeye and his evil sorceress, Cupess and the very evil Sea Witch who preys on beautiful girls "to extract their beauty". Luckily we have a good fairy (The Fairy of Hearts Desire), a talking Totem pole (The Idol, Captain Jeremiah Cockle of the good ship The Saucy Sal and his mate Mr. Mussel. The last two gentlemen vie for the favours of Sarah (they must both be blind!) and thrown in for good measure are some cannibals headed by Cannibola and his silly wife Graziola. Look out too for Tammina the beautiful servant of The Sea Witch and don't miss her belly dance with Neat and Juanita near the end of the show! With a story plot that includes love, kidnapping and buried treasure, a show full of colourful costumes, music, singing and dance, plus a fast paced script full of jokes — if the first one doesn't get you, the second one will!

There are as usual, loads of people to thank and this show is no exception. The back stage and production boys and girls have been magnificent. From the advertising posters, producer, the costume co-ordinator, set designer, construction workers, stage manager, front of house, lighting, sound, music, choreography programme, makeup, props, etc. etc. It would take too much space, but thank you, thank you. Without you, there would be no show.

Sit back then, participate with the cast and watch Robinson Crusoe (which has bits from Sinbad The Sailor, Dick Whittington, Little Red Riding Hood and The Little Mermaid plus some original material) and be captivated by the magic of pantomime.

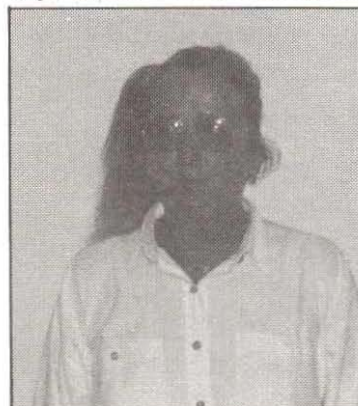

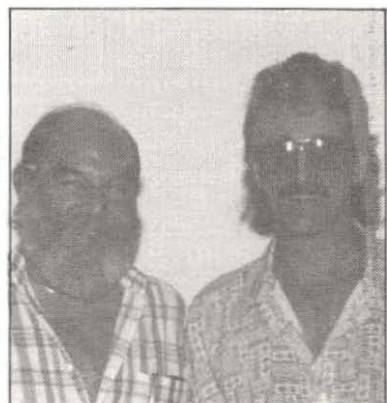

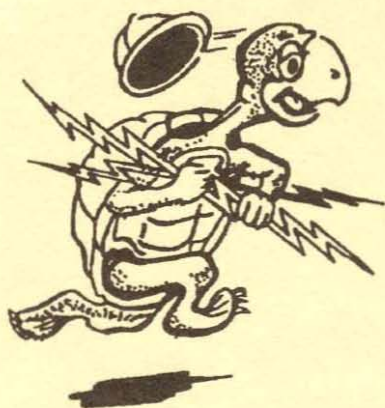
