



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A MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIRMAN

Over its history, the Cayman Drama Society has, through a constantly changing membership, covered the whole spectrum of dramatic art, many of the productions being staged in locations which appeared totally unsuitable for theatrical entertainment. However, for 22 years we have been blessed with a succession of dedicated actors, gifted directors and ingenious stage-managers who have all followed the motto "The Show Must Go On", which has enabled us to contribute to the cultural life of Cayman with an average of three productions per year.

Since moving into our own home at the Prospect Playhouse in October 1990 we now have the facility to increase the number of productions (this is our fifth in seven months!) and also to experiment with a wider range of dramatic styles. We are also fortunate in having a record level of membership at present. It is recognised that many of our members faithfully support our endeavours but do not wish to become actively involved either on stage or behind the scenes. However, we believe that many more would like to participate more fully but are reticent to volunteer because of lack of experience. I should like to encourage those members to come forward, and new members to join us, and "Share the Show" and assure them that they will receive the support and advice of our more experienced members, who are always keen to see new blood, sometimes literally when working backstage!

I should also like to take this opportunity of welcoming our visitors from overseas, and especially those of you who may be connected with theatre in your own locality, and would ask you to make yourselves known to us as we are anxious to establish links with other theatre groups for exchange of ideas, and possibly also productions.

Finally, my thanks to Jackie Balls and her production team for having the courage to embark on one of the most ambitious and lavish productions ever staged by the Cayman Drama Society. "My Fair Lady" has always been a favourite musical of mine and I know that, after tonight, it will be one of yours.

As can be seen a lot is going on in the background, however, we still have to recover the foyer floor (we have been offered a donation to cover part of this), landscape, car park to the rear, extra permanent storage, window to the control room, serving window to the kitchen, cover to the external staircase etc. etc. So, please, if you can do anything please contact any of the undersigned (after the last report someone enjoyed themselves so much they donated \$1,000 - many thanks to the donor).





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PROFILE OF ACTORS AND ACTRESSES

PROFESSOR HIGGINS - ALAN HALL

Since 1985 Alan Hall has taken a wide variety of roles, both onstage and backstage, for the Cayman Drama Society, but is probably best remembered for the parts which he has portrayed in our pantomimes and major musicals, notably as Tevye in Fiddler on the Roof and the Pirate King in Pirates of Penzance.

ELIZA DOOLITTLE - WENDY MOORE

She has performed in such Drama Society productions as Puss in Boots, Sing a Song of Sixpence and Cinderella. Also an active member of the former Inn Theatre she has performed in Guys and Dolls, Roaring 20's, Wonderland of Broadway and was awarded 1984's Actress of the Year award for Educating Rita. Last seen on stage in 1985 in Last of the Red Hot Lovers before going to study at the Eugene O'Neill Theatre Institute in the spring of 1986. Happily married for five years, her latest production is her one year old daughter, Lauren.

COLONEL PICKERING - JOHN GAYLOR

Apart from a University revue in Nairobi, John's theatrical experience had all been with the Awali Repertory Theatre Society in Bahrain. One audition night he went to offer his services backstage, and came out with the lead part - the sinister and nasty husband in The Sound of Murder. Once the initial panic subsided, it went well! The part of Dick Whittington's father-in-law was much less demanding. Most recently he played inspector Rough in Patrick Hamilton's Gaslight, a superb thriller. That was also the first appearance on stage of Colonel Pickering's frock coat!

ALFRED P. DOOLITTLE - PETER RILEY

Peter has been involved with the CDS since 1986. He has enjoyed various roles in musicals, thrillers and comedy; maybe he will be remembered as the Sea King in last year's pantomime. He has also been involved backstage and in front of house.

MRS. PEARCE - FREDA BETTANY

Freda has been in the chorus of Pirates of Penzance, an old lady in Pirate Princess and the housekeeper in Jane Eyre. She has helped backstage in all areas including dressing the dame for the pantomime! She is a little worried about being type-cast!

MRS. HIGGINS - JACQUELINE CAUNT

Jacqueline first trod the boards in 1986 in Alberta, Canada in a Neil Simon comedy God's Favourite. That was followed in quick succession by Lily the Felon's Daughter and Aunt Edwina. She has performed in England and Germany and her first performance in Cayman was as Mrs. Birling in An Inspector Calls.

MRS. EYNSFORD-HILL - MARLENE RILEY

Marlene is a strong supporter of the CDS. She played Josephine Skinflint, the wronged heroine in Robinson Crusoe. Changing roles you may have had the opportunity to enjoy her role as Judith in Boeing Boeing.


FREDDY EYNSFORD-HILL - PAUL DE FREITAS

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
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
